<b>Lesson (truth)</b>	We should obey our parents cheerfully and without delay. Although we don't always understand our parents' instructions, we should trust their wisdom without rationalizing and arguing. How to obey your parents when they're wrong?	As members of a family, we should use our differences to help each other through the ups and downs of everyday life. Families who honor the Lord are part of a bigger family--the family of God.	Friendship is a blessing from God because we can choose our friends. Although we can have many friends, our closest friends should be those who believe in God. We should be the kind of friend we would like to have.	Rules (and those who enforce them) are backed by the Lord (1 Tim 2:1-3). When we obey laws and rules, we please the Lord. Breaking rules and being disobedient is sin and gets us into trouble.	The first and greatest commandment is to love the Lord our God. When we love the Lord and put Him first, our other relationships are firmly grounded as well.

	Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right.	Therefore encourage one another and build each other up.	The heartfelt counsel of a friend is as sweet as perfume and incense.	Obey your leaders and submit to their authority.	Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.
<b>Life Application</b>	Ask children to give personal examples of how they have obeyed their mom or dad during the past week. Be aware that some children may come from a single parent homes or, at times, receive conflicting instructions from their parents. Emphasize the fact that God is pleased with them when they obey their parents.	Discuss sibling rivalry in the home. Encourage children look for the best in their brothers and sisters; to avoid quarrels, to forgive them and to encourage them. (For the single child, this could include cousins etc.)	Talk about the qualities of a good friend. Encourage children to be loyal and trustworthy in their relationships with their friends; never to take others for granted, be mean or gossip. A good friend brings out the best in others.	Rules have a purpose - they give us structure, make life fair for everyone and keep us safe. Encourage children to obey rules in the home, at school and on the road--and especially to keep the golden rule given by Jesus: to love God and to love others.	Our main purpose in life is to love God and glorify Him. When we do that, we feel fulfilled and at peace. Help children understand what it means to love the Lord--not just going to church etc, but that the Lord should be the One we think about most and talk to most.

Although we have earthly parents, God is a Father to each of us--a Father who loves us and provides for us, a Father who cares for us and watches over us.</p>	<p>We are all brothers and sister in Christ - we are part of God's big family.</p>	<p>Although God wants us to have friends and fellowship with others, Jesus is the best friend we could ever have. He is our forever friend.</p>	<p>God is the ultimate authority. His rules for life have been written for us in the Bible.</p>	<p>To have a relationship with God we must first accept Jesus as our Saviour. Then we need to grow in God through prayer, reading His Word, and living our lives for Him.</p>
<p><b>Story overview</b></p>	<p>King David wanted to start building the temple, but God said that his son Solomon was to build the temple. David gave Solomon detailed instructions on how to build the temple, and Solomon followed those instructions (instead of building it the way he thought it should look).</p>	<p>Isaac wanted to bless his oldest son, but his younger son tricked him into believing he was the older son. Jacob stole Esau's blessing. Esau planned to kill Jacob, but years later they were reconciled as brothers.</p>	<p>Compare: The four friends who lowered their paraplegic friend through the roof. They were prepared to go all out to help their friend. ***** The friends of Job who only gave him bad advice during a difficult time in Job's life.</p>	<p>Esther--even though she was the queen--showed submission to those in authority i.e. the king. She showed humility and respect by bowing to the king, waiting for permission to enter the king's throne room, and spoke to him with dignity. The result - the king granted her request.</p>	<p>Jesus forgives the sinful woman. She kissed his feet and puts perfume on them to show her love.</p>
